# **PRESENTATION**



In this second time I am proud to present our advances and to share everything we did from August 2017 to July 2019. In this period we learned to be more and more ourselves, achieving a faithful and honest version of the Hotel Saint George.

You will notice that the name of this report has changed (the first one was titled "First Report of Sustainability") and although it seems something insignificant, it is not casual since it has to do with a change of perspective and also with our own evolution as a company. On one hand, we realized that many of the values that define

sustainability are part of our company, from our essence and even from our beginnings. On the other hand, we consider that sustainability is not a separate area, but it integrates our DNA as an approach that goes entirely from one point to the other. 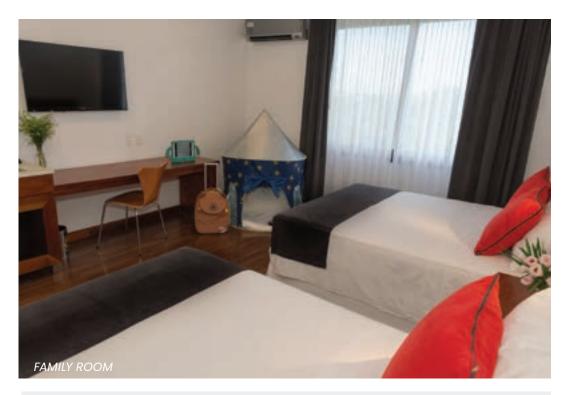
#### TRAVEL AGENCIES

We work to be more efficiently in the process of making reservations, as well as in special requirements; in order to make the guest experience adjusted to the expectations.

#### **ACCESSIBILITY**

The HSG supports inclusion and the provision of equal conditions for all the people, so it was making the necessary adjustments with the idea that more and more disabled people can enjoy its services. In this period:

- We remodeled the access ramp of the hotel .
- We opened an access ramp to the pool area.
- We made a **new path** for blind people and those with reduced mobility.
- We opened a **new bathroom in the restaurant** area for disabled people.
- We incorporated **Braille menues** in the Restaurant and Pubs.
- We incorporated a Braille Directory and Code of Ethics in the room for disabled people.
- We started installing Braille signs in all the public areas.

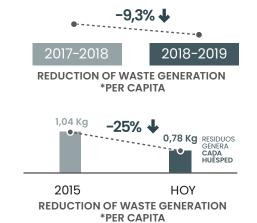

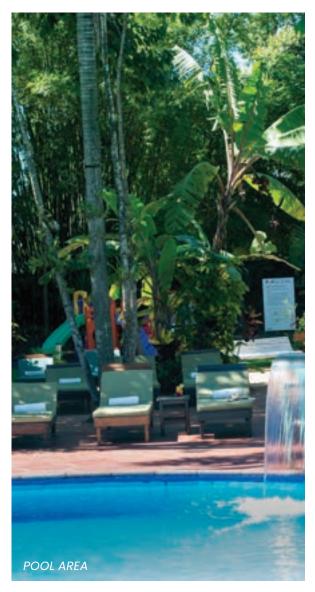

# JEJYÁ: TO PRODUCE PRESERVING THE FOREST

Jejy´a means pulp in Guaraní, pulp of the Palmito fruit.

HSG supports the purchase to undertakings like Cooperativa Agroecológica Península de Andresito, which sells fruit pulp of Palmito on a small scale (native and endemic palm tree of the Atlantic Forest) for gastronomic use.

This Project enocurages local families to make a productive use of their farms, specially of those areas of native forest. At the same time that the families diversify their production, the maintenance of native forest remanents are promoted.

From a social perspective, the Palmito is a crucial resource for the regional conservation and the wellfare of its producers.



# IN FIRST PERSON

"I think it's very good that Saint George has incorporated the Jejyá in the gastronomy and the interest in the promotion so in this way we achieve a short selling chain involved and personalized with the producers. Our goal is that this product becomes exclusive and genuine here and its consumption runs out in the region. We aim to develop a smart market, which does not generate more demand than that the resource can give and understand that it has certain periodicity, so it is not available all year. It is also important to know that the volume of production can change year by year. We desire that more hotels and Iquazú restaurants join this project."

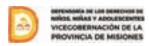

#### **COMMUNITY EXTENSION**

In 2018 the HSG decided to extend the the Sexual Commercial Exploitation Prevention Policy of Girls, Boys and Adolescents to the hotel industrial sector of the city of Puerto Iguazú presenting the Program of Good Practices for the Sexual Commercial Exploitation Prevention Policy of Girls, Boys and Adolescents. It has the technical assistance of National Ministry of Justice, the National Secretary of Government of Tourism, the Ombudsman of Girls, Boys and Adolescents of the Government of the Province of Misiones and UNICEF Argentina.









The Program started in April 2018 and finished in October of that year. It included an invitation to other hotel companies in order to receive training about the topic, training and monitoring on how to incorporate this policy and its application. The training was given by volunteers of the Reception Area of the HSG.

## **RESULTS:**

- 8 of the 9 registered companies finished the Program.
- The 84% of the business practices presented by the Program were adopted by the companies.
- 93% of Satisfaction of the Adherent Participants.
- 100% of Satisfaction of the Volunteers of HSG

The HSG adhered in 2018 to the Code of Conduct for the Protection of Girls, Boys and Adolescents Rights in Travel and Tourism, which is part of the Program of Responsible Tourism and Childhood of the National Secretary of Government of Tourism. 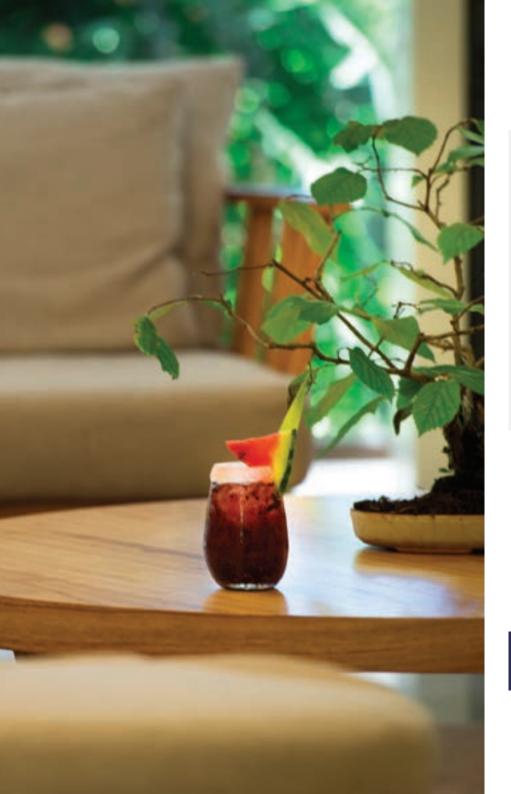
